Common Golf Terminology

Basic Terms

- Par: The number of strokes a skilled golfer should take to complete a hole.
- **Birdie:** One stroke under par for a hole.
- **Eagle:** Two strokes under par for a hole.
- Bogey: One stroke over par for a hole.
- Double Bogey: Two strokes over par for a hole.
- Triple Bogey: Three strokes over par for a hole.

Types of Shots

- **Drive:** A long shot from the tee, usually with a driver.
- **Putt:** A shot played on the green, usually with a putter.
- Chip: A short shot typically played from close to the green.
- **Pitch:** A shot with a high trajectory, usually played with a wedge, aimed to land softly on the green.
- Sand Shot/Bunker Shot: A shot played from a sand trap.

Course Features

- Fairway: The well-maintained area between the tee and the green.
- **Green:** The area of closely mowed grass surrounding the hole.
- Rough: The areas of longer grass bordering the fairway.
- Bunker: A sand trap on the course.
- **Hazard:** Any bunker or water feature on the course.

Clubs

- **Driver:** A club used for long-distance shots from the tee.
- Iron: Clubs numbered 1-9 used for a variety of shots.
- **Wedge:** Clubs designed for short approach shots and shots from sand.
- Putter: A club used for rolling the ball on the green.

Scoring

- Handicap: A numerical measure of a golfer's potential ability.
- **Stroke Play:** A scoring method where the total number of strokes taken over a round or series of rounds determines the winner.
- Match Play: A scoring method where the player or team with the most hole victories wins.

Miscellaneous

- **Tee:** The small stand used to hold the ball off the ground for the first stroke of each hole.
- **Tee Box:** The area where the first stroke of each hole is played.
- **Green Fee:** The cost to play a round of golf.
- Fore: A warning shouted to alert others of a potentially errant shot.
- Caddie: A person who carries a player's clubs and offers advice.
